12:30 P.M. SuperTour Finals

1:50 P.M. Masters/Citizens Finals

Forecast/Conditions: Expect a machine-worked track with the snow trucked in to cover the course on the Capitol square. Saturday night's low is expected to be in the mid-teens with race time temperature Sunday morning for the qualifications in the upper teens with partly sunny skies. Temperature should be in the mid 20s for the Finals.

Glidewax: Apply LF Moly, scrape and brush, then apply HF Red/HF Moly mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Red, brush with a dedicated nylon polishing brush and polish with a thermopad. HF Moly mix should help with dirt in snow.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Carbon BaseWax Green, cork smooth, let cool. For qualifications, then apply several layers of Carbon Blue, corking between layers. Those needing extra kick should use Carbon Viola. For finals, use Carbon Viola, or Carbon Red for extra kick. If glazing occurs, skiers may wish to substitute Carbon Yellow.

Structure: A universal grind covered by one pass with the Red TOKO Structurite tool (old medium offset wheel) before JetStream application will best suit these conditions.

Racing - Service

Check the WaxTip page at www.TokoUS.com before all of your races for the latest waxing information. The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
