

WAX RECOMMENDATION



Twin Cities Championship

Skate

Pursuit start

5k loop (snowmaking loop plus woods on back 9)

Forecast/Conditions: The groomers have done an excellent job preparing this course. Expect a firm base with a little sugary snow on top. Saturday evening expected low of -12 F with expected race time temperature of -6 F. Slight wind and mostly sunny.

Glidewax: Apply LF Blue/LF Moly mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. Then apply HF Blue, sprinkle on Nordlite Powder X-cold, iron in together, scrape and brush. Finish by rotocorking JetStream Blue, brush with a dedicated nylon polishing brush and polish with a thermopad.

Structure: A fine linear grind covered by one pass with the Blue TOKO Structurite tool (old fine-linear wheel) before the HF Blue/X-cold powder application will best suit these conditions.

Racing - Service

Check the WaxTip page at www.TokoUS.com before all of your races for the latest waxing information. The Toko Race Wax Tips offer racers precise waxing advice on how to make your skis perform optimally for a given event. For racers who don't have top end waxes, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream) and substitute the LF or System 3 wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue). For those who do not have a rotocork for applying JetStream, the next best thing is to iron it in.
