

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## LONG HALL LOPPET

Jackson Ski Touring Foundation, Jackson, NH - Sunday, March 9

9 A.M., 25k/13k/8k, Skate

Interval start, one lap

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**Forecast/Conditions:** Heavy rain Wednesday and Thursday. Overnight low of 18, rising slightly during the day with strong winds. Partly cloudy. Snow temperature should be in mid-20s.

**Glidewax:** Apply BP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Sprinkle on [Jet Powder](#) Red, make two passes with iron at 180c, let cool, scrape and brush. Polish with a merino wool roller. Then spray on [Jet Liquid](#) Red, let the ski dry flat for at least 20 minutes. No need to brush or polish Jet Liquid before skiing.

**Gripwax:** N/A

**Structure:** A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax or Jet Powder but before applying Jet Liquid will best suit these conditions.
