

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## Intermountain Junior National Qualifier 2018

Lake Creek, 2 mi. north of Ketchum/Sun Valley, ID

Sunday, January 28

10 A.M., Classic

**Forecast/Conditions:** Overnight low around 20, temperature at start 32, fresh snow likely. Mostly cloudy with a chance of rain and snow.

**Glidewax:** Apply LF Black (NF Black for U14), scrape and brush, then apply HF Red/HF Yellow mixed 1:1 (NF Red/NF Yellow mixed 1:1 for U14), scrape and brush.

**Gripwax:** Hold off on grip wax until close to start due to unpredictable conditions. If dry, likely Nordic GripWax Yellow. If wet, likely Nordic Klister Red or Klister Yellow. Both hardwax and klister works best with appropriate Toko Base Wax/Base Klister. If using skin skis, see our [skin treatment options](#) for best results.

**Structure:** One or multiple passes with the Yellow Structurite tool, or a medium/course stone grind for wet conditions will best suit these conditions.
