

WAX RECOMMENDATION



JNQ Holiday Classic Sprints

Elver Park, Madison, WI

Sunday, December 23

10 A.M. Qualifiers, 11:05 A.M Heats

1K course (expect course and start times to change)

2 laps, Classic

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low of 24 rising to 30 at the qualifier start and to the mid-30s for heats. Manmade snow will be dirty, firm tracks from overnight grooming. Partly sunny with steady 10 mph winds from the west and little chance of precipitation.

Glidewax: Junior Cup wax restrictions apply. Apply LF Black, scrape and brush, then apply HF Yellow, sprinkle on X-cold Powder, iron in together, scrape and brush. Clean glide zones by wiping thoroughly with Fibertex before each heat.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in one thick layer of Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply a thin layer of Nordic Klister Yellow. For Qualifiers, consider lightly covering the Klister Yellow with a thin layer of GripWax Yellow. Cork lightly, but do not cork the layers into each other. If using skin skis, see our [skin treatment options](#) for best results.

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Blue Structurite tool (before JetStream application) will best suit these conditions.

For racers who don't have top end waxes, skip the Fluorocarbon (JetStream or HelX) and substitute the LF or NF wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue).
