

WAX RECOMMENDATION



Crosscut Biathlon Race #2

Crosscut Mountain Sports Center, Bozeman, MT

Sunday, February 23

10 A.M.

Pursuit Format

Non-Novice: 4 shooting stages, 5 laps (course TBD)

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight partly cloudy with low near 20, temperature in the mid-20s at race start. Expect excellent firm snow conditions. Best to err on the cold side with glide wax and structure at Crosscut this time of the year.

Glidewax: Apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply High Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. For HP Liquid Paraffin, apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then spray on HP Liquid Blue, let sit in a warm room for at least one hour (overnight is best), polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin.

Gripwax: For Novice category skiers on classic skis, roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3-4 layers of Nordic GripWax Red, corking between layers.

Structure: A universal structure will best suit these conditions. If higher moisture than predicted, covering with one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing HP Hot Wax or before spraying HP LP may improve glide.

For racers who don't have top end waxes, skip the High Performance (Liquid Paraffin or Hot Wax) and substitute the Performance or Base Performance wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue).
