

WAX RECOMMENDATION



Stowe Derby - Updated!

Mt. Mansfield, Stowe, VT

Sunday, February 23

10 A.M. Skate, Noon Classic

20K, Point-to-point

Wave start, 5 people every 30 seconds

Forecast/Conditions: Saturday cloudy, overnight low about 22. Sunday partly sunny. The snow temperature at 10 A.M. will be high 20s on the trails lower on the mountain. For the noon race the snow temperature will be 30 to low 30s. Pistenbully groomed packed powder.

Glidewax: Apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply High Performance Red Hot Wax (Skate) or HP Yellow Hot Wax (Classic), scrape and brush. For HP Liquid Paraffin, apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then spray on HP Liquid Red (Skate) or HP Liquid Yellow (Classic), let sit in a warm room for at least one hour (overnight is best), polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Klister Green, smooth, let cool. Then apply one layer of Klister Yellow, smooth, let cool. Finish with two layers of GripWax Red, corking lightly between layers.

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool (Skate) or Yellow tool (Classic) after scraping and brushing HP Hot Wax or before spraying HP LP will best suit these conditions.
