

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## CXC Holiday Cup Championships Sprint

Michigan Tech Nordic Ski Trails, Houghton, MI

Saturday, January 2

9 A.M./1:25 P.M.

1.3K, Classic AM/Freestyle PM

Interval start, qualification only, 2 laps

**Forecast/Conditions:** Friday night mostly cloudy with a low around 20. Saturday partly sunny, 25 at A.M. start and 33 at P.M. start. Expect recent snow to be machine worked and packed, and classic tracks to glaze.

**Glidewax:** For the morning race, apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Liquid Paraffin Red, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply BP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush. For the afternoon race substitute BP Red Hot Wax and BP LP Yellow.

**Gripwax:** Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 2-3 layers of Nordic GripWax Yellow, corking between layers. Warmer wax recommended due to glazing tracks. Cover with 1 layer of Red to improve glide.

**Structure:** A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing final Hot Wax or before spraying Liquid Paraffin will best suit these conditions.

If an event allows fluorinated waxes and you choose to use them, use High Performance or Performance (Liquid Paraffin or Hot Wax) of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue), as the temperature ranges are the same.
