Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low 33, temperature at start 34. Manmade snow, PistenBully groomed, 50 percent chance of new mixed precipitation under cloudy skies.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Liquid Paraffin Yellow, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, iron in BP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3 layers of Nordic GripWax Yellow, corking between layers.

Structure: A wet structure covered by one pass with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final BP Hot Wax or before spraying BP Liquid will best suit these conditions.
