

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## Snow Mountain Ranch Classic

Snow Mountain Ranch, Granby, CO

Saturday, January 9 and Sunday, January 10

Self-scheduled race

7K & 15K, Classic

7.5K loop

**Forecast/Conditions:** Overnight lows for Friday and Saturday in the single digits F warming to the low 20s by midday. Sunday looks likely to have the fastest tracks early afternoon. The glide wax will be same for the weekend, but adjust kick wax accordingly.

**Glidewax:** Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Blue Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply another layer of BP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

**Gripwax:** Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 4-5 thin layers of Nordic GripWax X-Cold for morning or Blue for afternoon, corking between layers.

**Structure:** A fine structure will best suit these conditions.
