Forecast/Conditions: Friday night mostly cloudy with a low around -6F. Saturday mostly cloudy and cold, with a high near 2F. New snowfall of 4-6" leading up to event will be machine worked and packed. Expect dry abrasive conditions.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax and X-Cold powder mixed 1:1, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Blue Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax/X-Cold mix, apply an additional layer of BP Blue Hot Wax mixed with X-Cold powder 1:1, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3-4 layers of Nordic GripWax X-Cold, corking between layers.

Structure: A fine structure ski with no additional structure added will best suit these conditions.
