Forecast/Conditions: Light snow with some accumulation expected Saturday night with a low in the mid-20s. Flurries will diminish into Sunday as the temperature slowly rises to about 30 by mid-afternoon. Expect machine-groomed tracks with fresh snow cover that will break down as the temperature rises.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Red Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply BP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then cover with 3 layers of Nordic GripWax Yellow, corking smooth between layers. If using skin skis, treat skins with Eco Skin Proof. For best performance, apply Eco Skin Proof the day before the event.

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final BP Hot Wax or before spraying BP Liquid will best suit these conditions.
