

WAX RECOMMENDATION



Yellowstone Rendezvous Race 2021

Rendezvous Ski Trails, West Yellowstone, MT

Saturday, March 6

9 A.M. Start

45K, 30K & 15K, Skate & Classic technique

Mass start on a 15K course

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight partly cloudy with low near 15, temperature at start near 25 rising to mid-30s by noon. Expect a mix of newer and transformed snow and a firm track.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Red Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply BP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Slower ski speed as it warms up will be affected significantly more by the base structure than the wax.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3-5 layers (depending on distance & ski flex) of Nordic GripWax Red, corking between layers. For a slightly more transformed track, iron in a thin layer of Klister Base Green instead of the Nordic Base Green as the base layer (binder).

Structure: A universal structure covered by two passes with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final BP Hot Wax or before spraying BP Liquid will best suit these conditions.

If an event allows fluorinated waxes and you choose to use them, use High Performance or Performance (Liquid Paraffin or Hot Wax) of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue), as the temperature ranges are the same.
