


WAX RECOMMENDATION



The Great Bear Chase

Swedetown Ski Trails, Calumet, MI

Saturday, March 13

8 A.M. - 10 A.M.

50K Skiathlon, Classic and Freestyle - 2 loops

10K and 25K Classic and Freestyle

Mass start for each distance

Forecast/Conditions: Friday night mostly clear with a low around 18, warming overnight. Saturday sunny, with early start time temperature of 30 rising to 39 for latest starters. Expect machine tilled base and firm glazed tracks.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Red Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply BP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 1 full layer of Nordic GripWax Yellow with 4-6 small drops of Nordic Klister Red in middle half of kick zone and mix together. Cover with 2 more layers of Nordic GripWax Yellow, corking between layers.

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final BP Hot Wax or before spraying BP Liquid will best suit these conditions.
