

WAX RECOMMENDATION



Wisconsin High School Nordic Ski League Championship Classic

Birkebeiner Trailhead, Cable, WI

Sunday, March 7

10 A.M. - 11:30 A.M. MS 3K

12:30 P.M. - 2 P.M. HS 7K

Classic, Interval start, 1 lap

Forecast/Conditions: Saturday night mostly clear with a low around 22 and calm. Sunday partly sunny, with race temperature 40-47. South wind around 10 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Expect highly transformed, dirty, abrasive artificial snow.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on Base Performance Red Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing BP Blue Hot Wax, apply BP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in thin layer of Base Klister Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply Nordic Klister Yellow, spray with Nordic GripSpray Base Green. Mix with heel of hand until smooth to reduce icing and improve durability.

Structure: A universal structure covered by 1-2 passes with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final BP Hot Wax or before spraying BP Liquid will best suit these conditions.

If an event allows fluorinated waxes and you choose to use them, use High Performance or Performance (Liquid Paraffin or Hot Wax) of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue), as the temperature ranges are the same.
