Colorado Biathlon Mass Start

Snow Mountain Ranch, Granby, CO

Sunday, January 2

10:20 A.M. 1st wave start

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low of -9F, air temperature in the single digits by the start times. Expect slow dry snow conditions under sunny skies.

Glidewax: Apply High Performance Blue Hot Wax mixed 1:1 with X-Cold Powder, scrape and brush. Spray on HP Liquid Paraffin Blue, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, after scraping and brushing HP or BP Blue Hot Wax/X-Cold, apply a layer of HP or BP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush.
