Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low near 20, with Sunday high near 47. Start time temperature will be near 40 with mostly sunny skies and a breeze. Expect a machined skate deck comprised of mainly transformed snow, with some dirt present.

Glidewax: Apply High Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on High Performance Red Liquid Paraffin (for the 3K event, substitute HP LP Yellow for the HP LP Red), let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, apply BP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Red Hot Wax (for the 3K, substitute HP Yellow for HP Red), scrape and brush.

Gripwax: N.A.

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing HP Hot Wax or before spraying HP LP will best suit these conditions.
