

# WAX RECOMMENDATION **TOKO**<sup>®</sup>

## **Snow Mountain Ranch Classic**

Snow Mountain Ranch, Granby, CO

Saturday, January 14

10 A.M.

15K/7K, Classic

Mass start

2 x 7.5K loop

**Forecast/Conditions:** Overnight low of 9F warming to mid-teens by race start under mostly sunny skies. Tracks should be firm, but there could be some blowing snow.

**Glidewax:** Apply High Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on High Performance Blue Liquid Paraffin, let stand overnight, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP spray, apply BP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

**Gripwax:** Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3-4 layers of Nordic GripWax Blue, corking between layers. GripWax Red may be substituted if desire more kick.

**Structure:** A fine grind with no additional structure will best suit these conditions.
