

## 2024 Vermont EHSC/U16 Qualifier

Craftsbury Outdoor Center, Craftsbury, VT Sunday, February 11 10 A.M. Classic, 1 P.M. Skate 3K 15 second individual interval start

<u>Forecast/Conditions</u>: Overnight high of 41 with the temperature dropping to the mid-30s by late morning Sunday. Rain expected Saturday afternoon into evening, with new wet snow falling Sunday morning.

<u>Glidewax</u>: Apply High Performance Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Spray on High Performance Yellow Liquid Paraffin, let stand at least two hours, then polish with the Liquid Paraffin Polishing. If you do not have LP spray, apply BP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

<u>Gripwax</u>: Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Klister Green, cork smooth, let cool. Apply one thin layer of Yellow Klister, smooth and let cool. If icing occurs, cover with 1-2 thin layers of GripWax Yellow or Red, corking smooth. Zeros may be a good option too.

<u>Structure</u>: A wet structure covered by one pass with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax or before spraying HP LP will best suit these conditions.

If you do not have High Performance wax, substitute Performance or Base Performance wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue), as the temperature ranges are the same. All Race Wax Tips recommend ONLY fluorine-free products. Older HP or P Toko waxes (Liquid or Hot Wax) contain fluorine. New labels look very similar but all say PFC Free.
