WAX RECOMMENDATION



YELLOWSTONE SKI FESTIVAL 5K

Rendezvous Trails, West Yellowstone, MT – Saturday, Nov 30 10 A.M., 5K, Freestyle

<u>Forecast/Conditions:</u> Overnight low of -1F, temperature at start 1oF, new snow with accumulating snow in days leading up to the race. Snow flurries possible on race day with mostly cloudy skies.

<u>Glidewax:</u> Apply HP Blue Hot Wax, sprinkle on X-Cold Powder, iron in together, scrape and brush very well with copper brush followed by horsehair brush. If you do not have HP, apply BP Blue Hot Wax, sprinkle on X-Cold Powder, iron in together, scrape and brush. Liquid Paraffin is not recommended based on forecasted race time snow temperature.

<u>Gripwax:</u> Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3 layers of Nordic GripWax Blue, corking between layers. For more speed, cover with one layer of Nordic GripWax X-Cold and cork lightly.

Structure: A cold grind with no additional structure will best suit these conditions.
