

WAX RECOMMENDATION



NEW YEAR'S SKATE

Bogus Basin, Boise, ID - Sunday, Dec 29

10 A.M., 10k/5k/1k, Skate

Mass start – 2 laps

Forecast/Conditions: A foot or more of new snow is forecast in the days before the race. Saturday night low around 33 with snow likely. Snow and/or rain likely during the race with a start temperature around 36 and a high of 37. Expect fresh snow on a soft track.

Glidewax: Apply Base Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush. Apply High Performance Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush. If raining or snowpack is saturated, spray on HP Liquid Paraffin Yellow, let stand 2 hours, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If unsure of conditions, HP LP Yellow spray can be very fast on wet snow when applied right before the start (without brushing). If the temperature drops and the new snow is dry, skip the HP LP spray.

Gripwax: N/A

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions.

If you do not have High Performance wax, substitute Performance or Base Performance wax of the same color (Yellow, Red or Blue), as the temperature ranges are the same. All Race Wax Tips recommend ONLY fluorine-free products. Older HP or P Toko waxes (Liquid or Hot Wax) contain fluorine. New labels look very similar but all say PFC Free.
