## WAX RECOMMENDATION



## AMH CUP #2 HICKOK SKIATHLON

Kincaid Park, Anchorage, AK - Sunday, Jan 12
Noon, 1ok Skiathlon (5k CL, 5k SK)
Race course TBD because of inclement weather

<u>Forecast/Conditions:</u> Rain on Saturday, isolated showers before 9 P.M., then a 30 percent chance of rain after 3 A.M. Mostly cloudy with a low around 32. Sunday rain, cloudy with a high near 42. Trail will be a bit dirty and VERY transformed mostly manmade snow from the previous week of racing and grooming at US Nationals. Snow will be fast, even when wet.

Glidewax: Apply HP Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, spray on HP Liquid Paraffin Yellow, let stand at least 2 hours, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP, apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Yellow Hot Wax/HP Blue Hot Wax mixed 2:1, scrape and brush. The HP Blue will increase durability in the dirty abrasive snow and ice.

<u>Gripwax:</u> Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, apply Nordic Base Klister Green, heat and smooth. While still warm, apply Nordic Klister Yellow and Klister Red mixed 2:1 in an alternating chevron pattern, smooth, let cool.

<u>Structure</u>: A coarse universal structure covered by one pass with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions. Usually Kincaid needs a finer grind due to the glacial silt and dirt but transporting water will be a higher priority at this event
