<u>Forecast/Conditions:</u> Temperatures will be steadily dropping from highs in the 20s Saturday to around zero F Sunday morning. Expect a race time temperature of zero F to feel much colder due to high winds. The trail is firm older manmade snow that will slowly breakdown with heavy lap traffic.

<u>Glidewax:</u> If you have HP Blue Powder, this will be an excellent time to use it. Apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Blue Powder, scrape and brush. If you do not have HP Blue Powder, apply Performance Blue Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Blue Hot Wax, sprinkle on X-Cold Powder, iron in together, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: n/a

<u>Structure:</u> A fine linear structure covered by one pass with the Blue Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions.
