<u>Forecast/Conditions:</u> Temperature will be steadily dropping from highs around 30 Saturday to the mid-20s Sunday morning. Trace amounts of snow are expected to fall Saturday night. Expect race time temperature to start in the low 30s and rise toward 40 through the race day. The trail is firm older manmade snow with trace amounts of fresh snow mixed in that will breakdown with heavy lap traffic.

<u>Glidewax:</u> Apply HP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush, spray on HP Liquid Paraffin Yellow, let stand 2 hours, then polish with the Polishing Brush Liquid Paraffin. If you do not have LP, apply BP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush, then apply HP Yellow Hot Wax, scrape and brush.

Gripwax: n/a

<u>Structure:</u> A universal structure covered by one pass with the Yellow Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions.
