

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## BEECH NUTS JR RACE

**Nub's Nob Lower Ski Trails, Harbor Springs, MI -- Sunday, Jan 25**

10 A.M., 5k High School, 3k Middle School, 1.5k Elementary, Freestyle

Wave starts, 1 lap / 2 laps / 1 lap

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**Forecast/Conditions:** Overnight low of -3F, temperature at start 2F. Expect dry, packed powder. Expect mostly cloudy skies with little chance of snow overnight and during the race.

**Glidewax:** Apply HP Blue Hot Wax, sprinkle on X-Cold Powder, iron in together, scrape and brush well.

**Gripwax:** Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Wax Green, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply several layers of Nordic GripWax Blue, corking between layers. Finish with 1 layer of GripWax X-Cold, cork smooth. Those needing extra kick should skip the GripWax X-Cold.

**Structure:** A universal structure covered by one pass with the Blue Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions.
