

WAX RECOMMENDATION



ALPENGLLOW 20K

Tahoe Cross-Country Ski Center, Tahoe City, CA – Sunday, Feb 22

10 A.M., 20k/10k, Freestyle

Mass start, 1 lap per distance

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low 24, temperature at start 32, high of 37. New snow leading into the race and cold temps (by California standards) will have the snow skiing colder and drier. Expect cloudy, windy conditions and a 20 percent chance of snow during the race.

Glidewax: Apply HP Blue Hot Wax/HP Red Hot Wax mixed 1:1, scrape and brush, sprinkle on [Jet Powder](#) Red, make two passes with iron at 180c, let cool, scrape and brush using the copper brush and polish with a merino wool roller. Then quickly (1 to 2 seconds) spray [Jet Liquid](#) Red tail to tip, spread and polish using a handheld Thermo Cork, and go ski. If you are skiing 10k, use Jet Bloc Red (lightly rub on Jet Bloc Red, polish with the Rotary Brush Merino Wool, repeat the Jet Bloc rub/polish for a second coat) in place of Jet Powder Red, or stop waxing after the HP Blue/Red option.

Gripwax: N/A

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax or polishing the Jet Powder/Bloc but before applying Jet Liquid will best suit these conditions.
