Stratton Nordic Ski Trails, Stratton, VT – Sunday, Feb 22

10 A.M., 0.5k – 6k depending on age, Freestyle

Interval start

Forecast/Conditions: Overnight low 10F at 7 A.M. rising to 21 at start. There will be fresh new snow from Friday through Saturday, but course should be well groomed new snow on top of transformed snow. Moisture from new and transformed snow may create glazing conditions. It will be partly sunny with light winds throughout the day.

Glidewax: Apply HP Red Hot Wax, scrape and brush, lightly rub on Jet Bloc Red, polish with the Rotary Brush Merino Wool, repeat the Jet Bloc rub/polish for a second coat. Then quickly (1 to 2 seconds) spray [Jet Liquid](#) Red tail to tip, spread and polish using a handheld Thermo Cork, and go ski.

Gripwax: N/A

Structure: A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax or polishing the Jet Bloc but before applying Jet Liquid will best suit these conditions.
