

# WAX RECOMMENDATION



## MICHIGAN JUNIOR NORDIC SKI CHAMPIONSHIP

Hickory Hills, Traverse City, MI – Saturday, Feb 28

11 A.M., 5k, Classic and Skate

Pursuit – Classic A.M. and Skate P.M.

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**Forecast/Conditions:** Overnight low of 19, staying steady at 20 for much of the day. Expect the snow to be abrasive, have high moisture content and be a mix of new and manmade snow. Expect the snow to glaze, especially in the tracks. Expect partly cloudy skies.

**Glidewax:** This event has a wax protocol that allows only the ironed in paraffin wax that is provided by the Race Organization.

**Gripwax:** Roughen base with 150 grit sandpaper, iron in Nordic Base Klister, cork smooth, let cool. Then apply 3-4 layers of Nordic GripWax Red, corking smooth between each layer.

**Structure:** A universal structure covered by one pass with the Red Structurite tool, applied with a lot of force, after scraping and brushing the final Hot Wax will best suit these conditions.
